For children new to alternative care, placed in their initial placements, initial 24 hour worker child visits (one business day) are to be completed by child's Children's Service Worker or Host Worker in residence (placement) county per policy. For subsequent placements/moves, the child must also be seen within one business day. This visit can be completed by the case manager or the host county as arranged between the circuits. Visits with children during extended and trial home visits may be conducted by an external agency worker providing services to the child or family. The CSW must document the date of the visit, how safety was assured and any other information gathered by the external agency worker.
