

- 631 students served through Bulldog Basketball Academy, small group and one-on-one mentoring, SAAB, and after school clubs.



#### Resources

- We also provide Signs of Suicide trainings for our local school districts



# Medication Take-Back Events





- 6,980 pounds were collected across the region last year
- Since 2012, our Drug Take Back events have collected 86,186 pounds of medications



## SPRINGFIELD COMMUNITY LAND TRUST

- This program allows qualified buyers to purchase homes while the land beneath the home belongs to the Springfield Community Land Trust
- The homeowner holds rights to the land by paying a fee through a lease-hold agreement
- Homes within the program are typically remodeled or new construction homes that are energy efficient and equipped with new appliances and other amenities



Bringing innovation and collaboration together to identify the needs of the homeless in our community to address recommendations and meet goals within our 10 Year Plan to End Homelessness



Responsible for ensuring over \$1 million in HUD dollars are secured annually to support emergency and transitional housing providers, domestic violence shelters, and substance abuse recovery centers.



# O'Reilly Center for Hope

The O'Reilly Center for Hope serves as a community hub that brings together multiple partner agencies in support of affordable housing, financial stability, and the overall well-being of our community.

In 2022 we served 4,342 different guests and made 16,213 referrals within the Center
