







Gender of TANF Parent(s)/Caretaker(s)




Race of TANF Participants








Age of TANF Children



Average Monthly Caseload Fiscal Years 2012 - 2016





Figure 6. Food Stamps





Gender of Adults Receiving Benefits




Race of Individuals Receiving Benefits




Age of Adults Receiving Benefits


Age of Children Receiving Benefits


