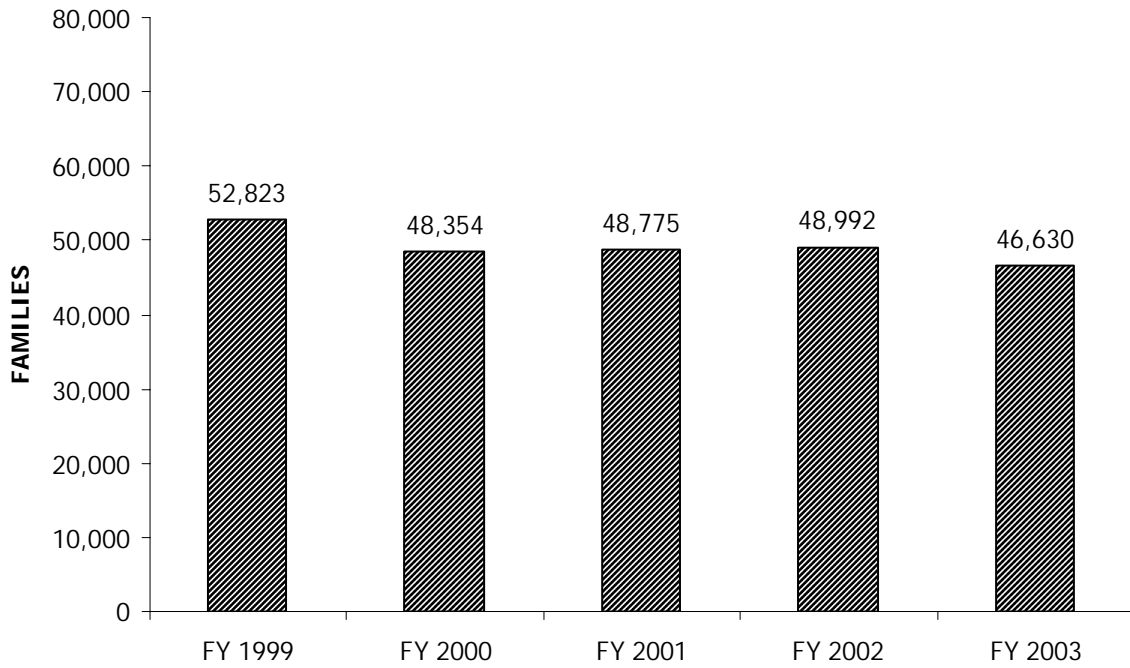

June 2003**

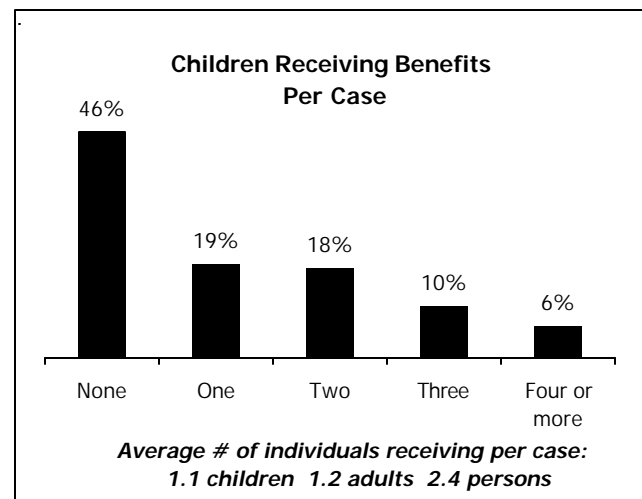
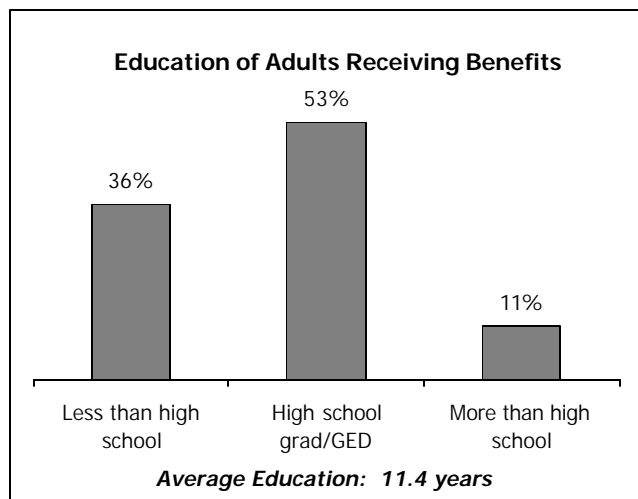
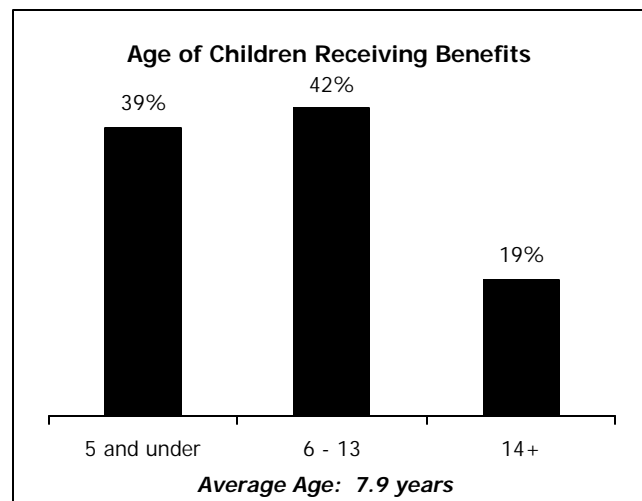
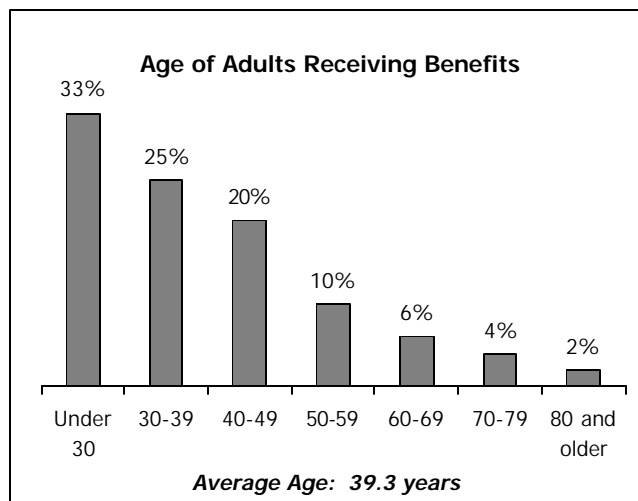
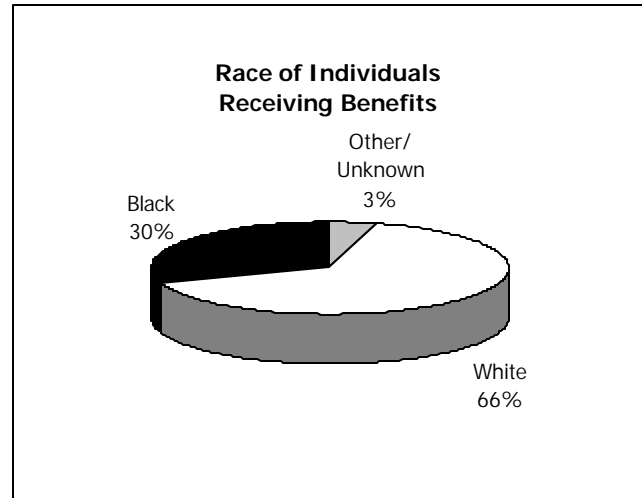
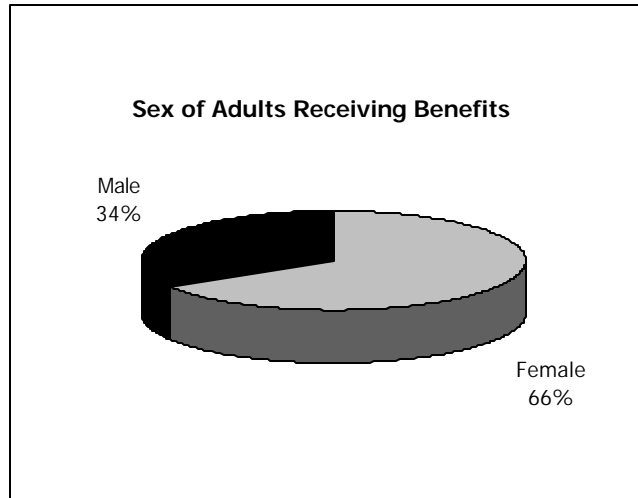


Figure 4. Food Stamps
Average Monthly Caseload Fiscal Years 1999-2003

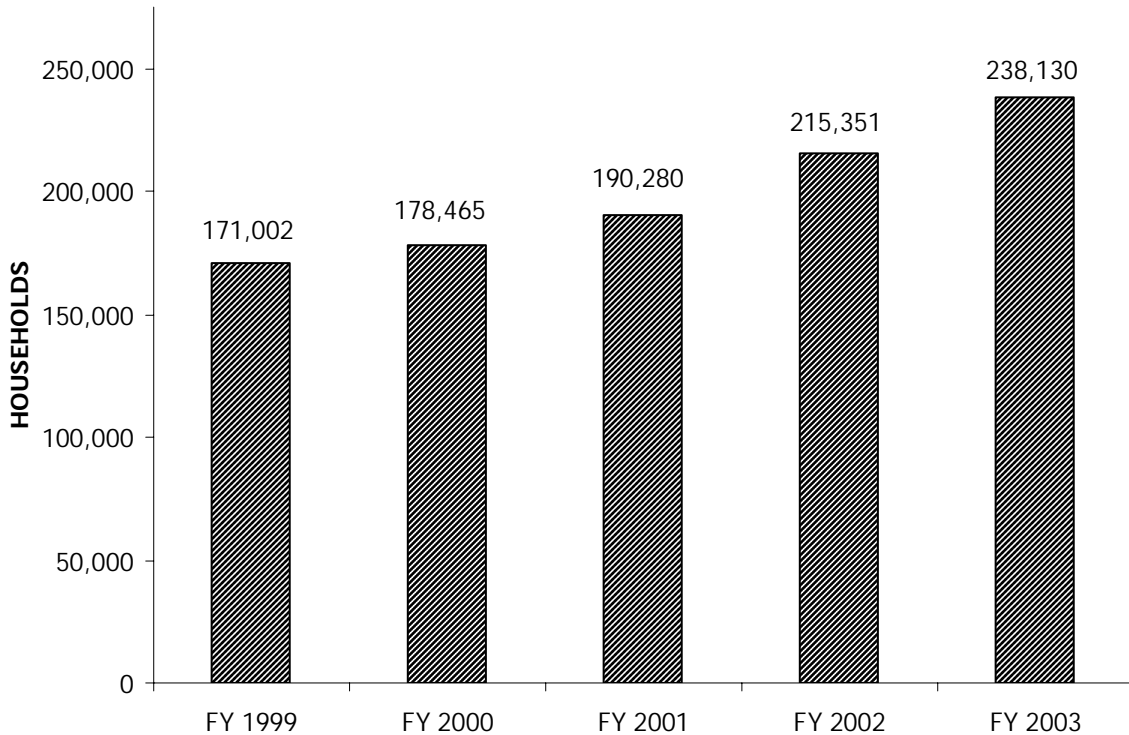

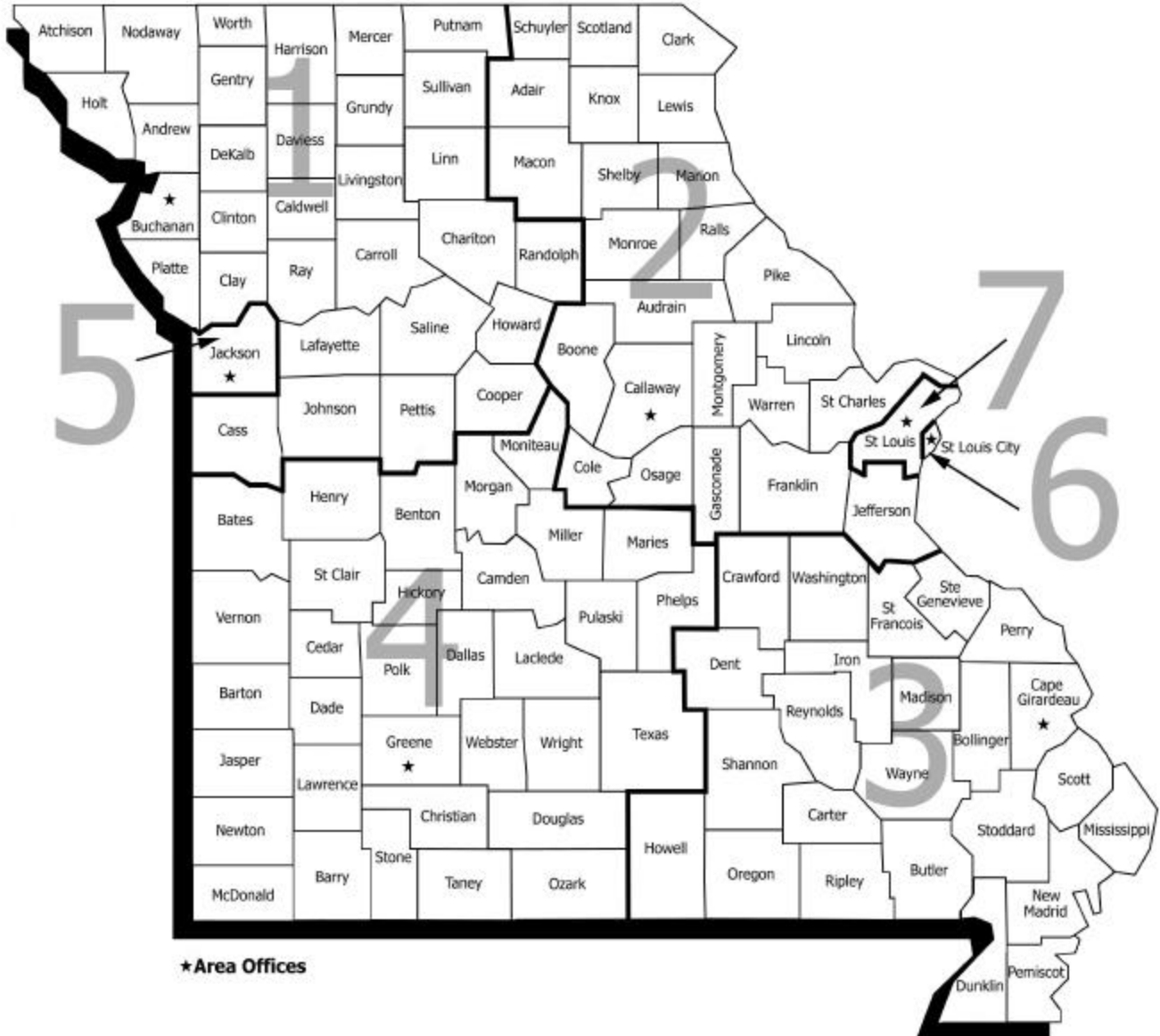
